COUNCIL AND COMMITTEES

Council and Committees

The Parish Council is made up of 9 seats with 4 being elected Councillors across 2 Council Wards and 3 Councillors being co-opted with two vacancies. The Full Council takes overall responsibility for all decisions but can choose to delegate authority to a committee or to a Council Officer but can never delegate authority to an individual Councillor.

To be more effective, the Council works with several working groups to spread the workload, review issues in more detail and operate more effectively.




CHRISTMAS TREE 2024



DONATED BY A RESIDENT OF TANKERSLEY




BOUNDARY CHANGES

THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOUNDARY COMMISSION IS THE INDEPENDENT BODY THAT DRAWS THESE BOUNDARIES. IT HAS REVIEWED BARNSLEY TO MAKE SURE COUNCILLORS WILL REPRESENT ABOUT THE SAME NUMBER OF ELECTORS, AND THAT WARD ARRANGEMENTS WILL HELP THE COUNCIL WORK EFFECTIVELY.

IT IS UNDERSTOOD THAT TANKERSLEY WILL MOVE TO A NEW WARD ALONGSIDE DODWORTH AND STAINBOROUGH TO FORM THE NEW DODWORTH WARD, WHICH WILL MEAN THAT TANKERSLEY IS NO LONGER PART OF PENISTONE EAST.

THE CHANGES BECOME LAW ONCE PARLIAMENT HAS APPROVED THEM. WE ARE PREDICTING THESE ARRANGEMENTS WILL IN PLACE FOR THE MAY 2026 ELECTIONS.

COULD YOU BE A PARISH COUNCILLOR?

PARISH COUNCILS ARE THE FIRST TIER OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT, BUT WHAT DOES THAT ACTUALLY MEAN? MORE IMPORTANTLY, COULD YOU DO IT?

A LOT OF PEOPLE THINK PARISH COUNCILLORS ARE JUST RETIRED OLD FOLKS WITH TOO MUCH TIME ON THEIR HANDS. WHAT WE ARE IS A GROUP OF PEOPLE TRYING TO BUILD A BETTER FUTURE FOR OUR VILLAGE. WE ARE PROBABLY THE OLDER END OF THE AGE SPECTRUM, AND WE REALISE THAT'S EXACTLY WHY WE NEED YOUNGER VOICES AT THE TABLE.

WHAT DOES A PARISH COUNCILLOR DO?

WE LISTEN TO THE PEOPLE OF OUR VILLAGES, AND WE TRY TO GET THINGS DONE. WE MIGHTWORK WITH BARNSLEY COUNCIL ON ROAD SAFETY, REVIEW PLANNING APPLICATIONS, IMPROVE AND PROTECT COMMUNITY SPACES, OR FIGHTING FOR FUNDING FOR LOCAL PROJECTS. WE'RE HERE TO RAISE CONCERNS, FIND SOLUTIONS, AND MAKE SURE OUR VILLAGE HAS A VOICE.

WHO CAN APPLY?

IF YOU'RE OVER 18, LIVE LOCALLY, AND CARE ABOUT WHERE YOU LIVE, YOU'RE ALREADY HALFWAY THERE. YOU DON'T NEED FANCY QUALIFICATIONS, JUST A BIT OF TIME, AN INTEREST IN THE COMMUNITY, AND A WILLINGNESS TO GET INVOLVED.

WHY DO WE NEED YOU?

BECAUSE THE FUTURE OF OUR COMMUNITY CANNOT BE DECIDED SOLELY BY AN OLDER GENERATION. WE NEED YOUNGER PERSPECTIVES, FRESH IDEAS, AND THE KIND OF ENERGY THAT DRIVES REAL CHANGE. YOUR SKILLS, EXPERIENCES, AND DIGITAL KNOW-HOW CAN HELP SHAPE THE VILLAGE IN WAYS THAT WORK FOR EVERYONE, NOT JUST THOSE WHO HAVE BEEN HERE THE LONGEST OR WERE BORN HERE.

HOW CAN THIS HELP YOUR CAREER?

- FOR YOUNGER PEOPLE, BECOMING A PARISH COUNCILLOR ISN'T JUST ABOUT "GIVING BACK" BUT A SMART CAREER MOVE. IT SHOWS INITIATIVE, LEADERSHIP, AND A COMMITMENT TO MAKING A DIFFERENCE, QUALITIES THAT EMPLOYERS LOVE. PLUS. IT'S A GREAT WAY TO DEVELOP SOME USEFUL SKILLS.
 - LEADERSHIP & DECISION-MAKING YOU'LL GAIN REAL EXPERIENCE IN DEBATING ISSUES, MAKING DECISIONS, AND SEEING PROJECTS THROUGH—GREAT FOR ANY MANAGEMENT OR LEADERSHIP ROLE.
- PROBLEM-SOLVING & NEGOTIATION YOU'LL DEAL WITH REAL-WORLD CHALLENGES, WORK WITH DIFFERENT PEOPLE, AND LEARN HOW TO PUSH FOR CHANGE—A SKILLSET THAT'S INVALUABLE IN BUSINESS, LAW, AND PUBLIC SERVICE.
 - PUBLIC SPEAKING & COMMUNICATION IF THE IDEA OF SPEAKING UP IN MEETINGS OR PRESENTING IDEAS MAKES YOU NERVOUS, THIS IS A GREAT WAY TO BUILD CONFIDENCE IN A SUPPORTIVE ENVIRONMENT.
 - NETWORKING & INFLUENCE YOU'LL MEET LOCAL GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS, BUSINESS OWNERS, AND COMMUNITY LEADERS, OPENING UP OPPORTUNITIES YOU MIGHT NOT HAVE CONSIDERED.
 - CV & LINKEDIN BOOST LISTING 'PARISH COUNCILLOR' ON YOUR CV OR LINKEDIN PROFILE INSTANTLY MAKES YOU STAND OUT. IT HIGHLIGHTS LEADERSHIP, COMMITMENT, AND HANDS-ON EXPERIENCE WITH REAL-WORLD DECISION-MAKING.
- COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT & DIGITAL SKILLS IF YOU HELP WITH COUNCIL OUTREACH (NEWSLETTERS, SOCIAL MEDIA, EVENTS), YOU'LL GAIN VALUABLE EXPERIENCE IN COMMUNICATION, MARKETING, AND PUBLIC RELATIONS.

READY TO STEP UP?

IF YOU'VE EVER THOUGHT, WHY DOESN'T SOMEONE DO SOMETHING ABOUT THAT?, MAYBE THAT SOMEONE SHOULD BE YOU. YOUR VOICE MATTERS, YOUR IDEAS MATTER, AND YOUR ENERGY COULD BE EXACTLY WHAT OUR VILLAGE NEEDS. AND WHO KNOWS? THIS MIGHT JUST BE THE FIRST STEP TOWARDS SOMETHING BIGGER.

THE IMPACT OF LED STREETLIGHTS

IF YOU'VE EVER WALKED IN TANKERSLEY AFTER SUNSET AND FELT LIKE THE DARKNESS WAS... DARKER THAN BEFORE, YOU'RE PROBABLY NOT IMAGINING IT. THE SWITCH FROM TRADITIONAL HIGH PRESSURE SODIUM LAMPS TO NEW LED LIGHTING HAS CHANGED HOW OUR STREETS ARE LIT, AND WHILE THERE ARE BENEFITS, IT HAS ALSO INTRODUCED SOME UNEXPECTED RISKS, ESPECIALLY FOR PEDESTRIANS AND DOG WALKERS. SO WHAT'S CHANGED?

HIGH-PRESSURE SODIUM (HPS) LAMPS HAVE BEEN THE MAIN STREET LIGHTING FOR MANY YEARS, CASTING THEIR FAMILIAR ORANGE LIGHT. THEY WEREN'T PERFECT, BUT THEY TENDED TO SPREAD LIGHT MORE EVENLY, MAKING IT EASIER TO SEE PEOPLE AND OBJECTS EVEN OUTSIDE THE DIRECT BEAM. WITH ENERGY EFFICIENCY AND SUSTAINABILITY TARGETS IN MIND, MANY COUNCILS, INCLUDING BARNSLEY, HAVE REPLACED SODIUM WITH NEW LED STREETLIGHTS. LEDS LAST LONGER AND USE FAR LESS POWER, BUT HIGHLY FOCUSED BEAMS ONLY ILLUMINATE SPECIFIC AREAS, LEAVING LARGE PATCHES OF PAVEMENT IN NEAR DARKNESS.

THE PROBLEM FOR PEDESTRIANS

UNLIKE THE OLDER LAMPS THAT CREATED A MORE DIFFUSED GLOW, LED STREETLIGHTS DON'T SCATTER THEIR LIGHT WIDELY.

THIS MEANS:

- ROADS ARE BETTER LIT THE LIGHT IS DIRECTED EXACTLY WHERE NEEDED, REDUCING WASTE AND GLARE FOR DRIVERS.
- PAVEMENTS AND VERGES ARE DARKER IF YOU'RE WALKING JUST OUTSIDE THE BEAM, YOU MAY BE NEARLY INVISIBLE TO ONCOMING TRAFFIC.
- CAR HEADLIGHTS DON'T HELP MODERN LED CAR HEADLIGHTS ARE ALSO HIGHLY DIRECTIONAL, MEANING THEY ONLY ILLUMINATE WHAT'S DIRECTLY IN FRONT OF THEM, RATHER THAN SPREADING LIGHT TO THE SIDES.

HOW CAN WE STAY VISIBLE?

- IF YOU'RE OUT WALKING AFTER DARK WITH YOUR DOG, OR NOT, HERE ARE SOME TIPS YOU CAN USE TO MAKE SURE YOU'RE SEEN
 - WEAR SOMETHING REFLECTIVE A SMALL STRIP ON A JACKET OR A REFLECTIVE ARMBAND MAKES A HUGE DIFFERENCE. MANY DOG LEADS AND COLLARS ALSO COME WITH BUILT-IN REFLECTORS. THESE ARE READILY AND CHEAPLY AVAILABLE ON-LINE
- BE EXTRA CAUTIOUS AT JUNCTIONS AND CROSSINGS JUST BECAUSE YOU CAN SEE A CAR, IT DOESN'T MEAN THEY CAN SEE YOU.
 - STICK TO BETTER LIT PATHS WHERE POSSIBLE, WALK WHERE THE STREETLIGHTS PROVIDE SOME ILLUMINATION.
- BE AWARE OF BLIND SPOTS CAR HEADLIGHTS DON'T ALWAYS REVEAL WHAT'S AT THE SIDE OF THE ROAD UNTIL THE LAST MOMENT, SO ASSUME DRIVERS CANNOT SEE YOU.
- IT'S NOT ABOUT CHANGING WHAT WE DO, JUST ADAPTING TO THE CHANGES AROUND US. THE GOOD NEWS IS THAT A LITTLE VISIBILITY GOES A LONG WAY, BOTH FOR OUR SAFETY AND FOR DRIVERS WHO'D MUCH RATHER SEE US WELL IN ADVANCE THAN AT THE LAST SECOND!

A LITTLE BIT OF HISTORY


LOOKING BACK IN TIME: THE VILLAGE RAILWAY STATION
WITH SO MANY NEW RESIDENTS JOINING OUR PARISH, ONE OF THE MOST
FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS IS, "DID THE VILLAGE REALLY HAVE ITS OWN
RAILWAY STATION?" THE ANSWER IS A RESOUNDING YES! AND WHILE IT'S HARD TO
IMAGINE TODAY, THE BUSTLING STATION ONCE STOOD WHERE THE GRANGE
HOUSING ESTATE IS TODAY - A HIVE OF ACTIVITY TRANSFORMED BY THE PASSAGE OF
TIME.


OPENED IN FEBRUARY 1855, THE STATION FEATURED AN ELEGANT CANOPY OVER ITS ENTRANCE AND BOASTED A PRIVATE WAITING ROOM RESERVED FOR NONE OTHER THAN THE EARL OF WHARNCLIFFE. UNFORTUNATELY, THE STATION'S DAYS CAME TO AN END ON 7 DECEMBER 1953. ORIGINALLY INTENDED TO SERVE PILLEY, BIRDWELL, AND HOYLAND COMMON, THE STATION'S INITIAL SITE WAS MOVED HALF A MILE CLOSER TO PILLEY. THIS CHANGE WAS MADE TO ACCOMMODATE THE EARL'S NEARBY WHARNCLIFFE SILKSTONE COLLIERY, BUT IT ALSO MADE THE STATION LESS CONVENIENT FOR MUCH OF THE LOCAL POPULATION. THE LANDSCAPE HAS CHANGED SO MUCH SINCE THEN, THE MOTORWAY CUTTING A PHYSICAL BARRIER TO WHAT WAS ONCE A TRANQUIL LANDSCAPE AND CHANGING HOW THE VILLAGE TRAVELED FOREVER. BUT THROUGH PHOTOS AND STORIES, WE CAN REVISIT HOW THIS AREA ONCE LOOKED AND RELIVE A FASCINATING PIECE OF OUR HISTORY.





TANKERSLEY COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION CONTINUES TO GROW FROM STRENGTH TO STRENGTH WITH THE RANGE OF EVENTS DURING THE PAST YEAR PROVING THE VALUE OF THE RESOURCE TO THE LOCAL COMMUNITY. THE 9-STRONG COMMITTEE, AIDED BY AN INCREASING NUMBER OF VOLUNTEERS AND SUPPORTERS, WORK TIRELESSLY TO ENSURE THE LONG TERM VIABILITY OF THE HALL, COMMUNITY GREEN AND ASSOCIATED RESOURCES. TCA IS FINANCIALLY SECURE AND HAS GROWN A SUBSTANTIAL 'RESERVE' TO FUND FUTURE REPAIRS, IMPROVEMENTS AND DEVELOPMENTS.



RECENT INITIATIVES HAVE RESULTED IN THE

KEY HEADLINES FROM THE SUBMITTED QUESTIONNAIRES

- THERE WERE 97 RESPONSES IN TOTAL. THE POPULATION OF THE PARISH WAS
 ABOUT 1900 IN 2021 SO THIS REPRESENTS ABOUT 5% OF ALL LOCAL RESIDENTS.
 NOT ALL RESPONDENTS ANSWERED EVERY QUESTION AND THE PERCENTAGES
 GIVEN BELOW ARE THE PERCENTAGE OF RESPONDENTS WHO ANSWERED THAT
 QUESTION.
- A LARGE MAJORITY OF RESPONDENTS (94%) SUPPORTED THE DRAFT VISION BUT THERE WERE CONCERNS ABOUT THE NEED TO PROTECT THE GREEN BELT, LIMIT FURTHER NEW HOUSING DEVELOPMENT AND ADDRESS TRAFFIC AND INFRASTRUCTURE PROBLEMS.RECENT WAREHOUSING DEVELOPMENTS OFF THE MI HAVE HAD VARIOUS ADVERSE IMPACTS ON THE AREA.
- 89% OF RESPONDENTS SUPPORTED THE DRAFT OBJECTIVES. SUGGESTIONS INCLUDED THE NEED TO ADDRESS LOCAL ENVIRONMENTAL PROBLEMS BETTER, THAT THERE ARE ENOUGH HOUSES, EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES AND COMMUNITY FACILITIES ALREADY, HERITAGE AND OPEN SPACES NEED PROTECTING AND EXISTING HOUSING IS UNAFFORDABLE FOR MANY AND DOES NOT MEET LOCAL NEEDS.
- 69% OF RESPONDENTS SUPPORTED THE PARISH COUNCIL COMMISSIONING A
 LOCAL HOUSING NEEDS SURVEY TO BETTER UNDERSTAND THE TYPES, SIZES AND
 TENURES OF HOUSES NEEDED LOCALLY. THERE WERE SUGGESTIONS FOR
 SMALLER AND AFFORDABLE HOMES SO LOCAL PEOPLE CAN STAY IN THE AREA
 BUT A NEED TO ENSURE CHARACTER IS PROTECTED.
- 81% OF RESPONDENTS SUPPORTED THE COMMISSIONING OF DESIGN CODES
 AND GUIDANCE TO HELP ENSURE NEW DEVELOPMENT IS OF HIGH QUALITY AND SUSTAINABLE DESIGN WHICH FITS IN WITH THE LOCAL CHARACTER.

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

- THERE WERE MANY COMMENTS ABOUT EXISTING COMMUNITY FACILITIES AND A RANGE OF SUGGESTIONS FOR IMPROVEMENTS. THE HUB (FORMER WELFARE HALL) IS HIGHLY VALUED BY MANY WITH 85% OF RESPONDENTS USING IT. IDEAS FOR THE PARISH INCLUDED THE PROVISION OF A BROADER RANGE OF FACILITIES THAT CATER FOR ALL AGES INCLUDING FOR LEISURE AND SPORTS, AND MANY SUGGESTIONS FOR A PUB/CAFÉ/BISTRO TYPE VENUE WHERE THE COMMUNITY CAN SOCIALISE TOGETHER. SOME PLAY AREAS NEED MORE INVESTMENT AND THERE IS A NEED FOR BETTER CHILDCARE AND HOLIDAY CLUBS.
- THERE WAS SIGNIFICANT SUPPORT FOR RESEARCHING AND PROMOTING THE PARISH'S INTERESTING LOCAL HERITAGE INCLUDING IDENTIFYING POSSIBLE BUILDINGS AS LOCAL HERITAGE ASSETS. 95% OF RESPONDENTS WANTED TO SEE THIS INCLUDED IN THE PLAN. THERE WERE LOTS OF SUGGESTIONS FOR IMPORTANT LOCAL BUILDINGS, SITES AND STRUCTURES AND IDEAS ABOUT HOW MORE COULD BE DONE TO PUBLICISE OUR UNIQUE HERITAGE INCLUDING DISPLAYS, EVENTS AND GUIDED WALKS.
- LOCAL RESIDENTS REMAIN VERY CONCERNED ABOUT TRAFFIC HAZARDS SUCH AS SPEEDING AND RAT RUNNING AND PARKING PROBLEMS, PARTICULARLY AROUND THE SCHOOL. THE NEED FOR BETTER BUS SERVICES WAS NOTED.
- THERE WERE SUGGESTIONS FOR IMPROVEMENTS AND REPAIRS TO FOOTPATHS AND VARIOUS ROAD SAFETY MEASURES. THESE WOULD HELP TO ENCOURAGE MORE WALKING AND CYCLING SO THAT MORE PEOPLE CAN ACCESS AND ENJOY THE SURROUNDING COUNTRYSIDE.
- THERE WAS A LOT OF INTEREST IN THE NEED TO PROTECT OPEN SPACES AND TO
 TAKE OPPORTUNITIES TO IMPROVE THEM FOR WILDLIFE AND PEOPLES' HEALTH AND
 WELLBEING.THIS INCLUDED BOTH GREEN BELT AND SMALLER LOCAL GREEN SPACES
 IN AND AROUND THE VILLAGES. THERE WERE MANY SUGGESTIONS FOR
 IMPROVEMENTS TO SPORTS FACILITIES.
 - THERE WERE CONCERNS THAT THE PLAN SHOULD SAY MORE ABOUT ST PETERS CE PRIMARY SCHOOL AS IT PLAYS SUCH AN IMPORTANT PART IN THE LIFE OF THE COMMUNITY.

OVERALL, THERE WERE MANY DETAILED SUGGESTIONS AND IDEAS WHICH WILL NEED CAREFUL CONSIDERATION. SOME COMMENTS PROVIDED CONTRADICTORY VIEWS ABOUT KEY ISSUES SUCH AS HOUSING, BUT MANY WERE IN GENERAL AGREEMENT, AND REINFORCED THE NEED TO ADDRESS THE IDENTIFIED KEY PLANNING ISSUES AND THEMES.

A SIGNIFICANT PROPORTION OF COMMENTS RELATED TO POSSIBLE FUTURE ACTIONS AND ACTIVITIES RATHER THAN PLANNING POLICIES FOR FUTURE DEVELOPMENT. THESE WILL NEED CAREFUL SCRUTINY AS WELL. THE PARISH COUNCIL IS A SMALL ORGANISATION WITH LIMITED RESOURCES AND CANNOT TACKLE THESE PROBLEMS ALONE, BUT THE PROPOSALS MAY BE USED TO INFORM FUTURE ACTIVITY SUPPORTED OR LED BY OTHER ORGANISATIONS AND VOLUNTEERS OVER A LONGER TIMESCALE.

NEXT STEPS

- THE PARISH COUNCIL IS APPLYING FOR MORE GRANT FUNDING AND SUPPORT TO CONTINUE THE WORK ON THE NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN THIS FINANCIAL YEAR. WE AIM TO COMPLETE THE FULL DOCUMENT BY 2026.

- AS WE PROGRESS WORK ON THE DRAFT PLAN, WE WILL ARRANGE FURTHER INFORMAL PUBLIC CONSULTATION EVENTS SO THAT RESIDENTS AND STAKEHOLDERS CAN STAY INVOLVED AND HAVE THEIR SAY AT ALL STAGES.

TPEG Report 2024-25

TPEG – Tankersley and Pilley Environment Group

Over the past year the group has been busy with maintenance as well as new projects.

Over the years and still carrying on we have been keeping paths through local woodlands clear. The path leading from the bottom of Pilley Green to Potter Holes and others in the area quickly become overgrown and it is a continuing job to keep them clear. Similarly in Broad Ings, the Parish's own woodland, strimming keeps the paths clear of nettles and brambles. In Broad Ings we also keep some glades open to show off lovely patches of snowdrops and bluebells. The roadside daffodils planted many years ago are particularly splendid this year - just look at those on Pilley Lane. Those of us involved in the planting will have memories of how difficult it was on the steep bank digging into pure shale. Crocuses tend to die off over time so we have done some planting of new ones at the top of Lidgett Lane. Nine oak tree saplings planted in the playing field at the back of the Welfare Hall (the Hub) are looking splendid and more like adult trees so we have done some pruning of lower branches to encourage higher growth. Sadly a number of the trees planted on the Lidgett Lane playing field by BMBC have died and we have removed them. Others we have done our best to keep going as well as planting some new ones we have grown ourselves. Installed over 20 years ago by TPEG the Pilley and Tankersley village stones have been cleaned and repainted, something which needs doing every few years.

Litter picking remains an ongoing organised task, not one we particularly enjoy, but we would rather do that than see the rubbish spoiling our roads. The dates are posted on the village Facebook and we invite anyone to come along and help tidy the village. Litter pickers and bags are provided. It is pleasing to note that a number of residents quite independently undertake litter picking.





We now undertake maintenance of the flower bed in front of the Welfare Hall. Recently we put in wooden edging for a neater appearance using old wooden decking donated to us so there was no material cost. In addition to seasonal pruning and weeding we have put in new plants, either bought or grown by ourselves.

Some years ago when it became clear that the Lidgett Lane playing field was no longer being used for sport we persuaded BMBC not to routinely mow some parts of the field so they would become a meadow – rewilding. Since then we have been planting wild flower plug plants and sowing seeds to increase the biodiversity of the area. This work continues.

Clearing areas in and around the dipping pond just off New Road continues. The bushes alongside the pathway are rather robust growers and need cutting back regularly. The wooden observation boardwalk was installed as a joint BMBC / TPEG project some 20 years ago. However, there is some uncertainty about the structural integrity of the boardwalk and we wait an assessment by BMBC.

We are grateful to the Parish Council for granting us an award for running costs to cover not only consumables such as petrol(for the strimmers), but seeds, plants, insurance and other items. So residents indirectly support TPEG through the Parish Council precept: we hope you appreciate what we do. We are an informal group and anyone can join. Look out on Facebook for what we do and join in if you would like to.
